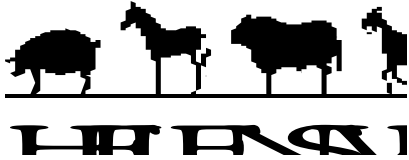

A Rich History

The first Helensville A&P Show took place in January 1900. Arranged by a keen group of locals, the Show began at the same site it occupies now, what used to be the Stewart's paddock at the North end of town. In 1909, under the direction of a newly formed committee, the Show moved to opposite the Kaipara Dairy Factory on Mill Road. It remained here (except for a few Shows at the Aitkenhead's Parakai farm) until 1955, when the property was sold and the Show returned to the original site, by then owned by the Helensville District Racing Club.

The A&P Show was always a highlight of the year for many locals and the whole district would get involved. Dairy, equestrian and indoor sections were strong from the outset and many locals recall the busy preparation in the week before the event. People travelled by train from Auckland to make the day and many others arrived by horse.

Sideshows were a popular feature, though coconut shies and merry-go-rounds preceded the huge attractions we have today. One ever popular contest involved lining beer bottles up on a fence which riders had to race past on their horses and try to knock off with a stock whip.

Show day used to end with a big ball in the evening, the favourite part for many ladies and young people. Everybody put on their Sunday best, often after having raced home for milking, and returned to the show grounds to chat, drink and dance the night away.

The Show has been associated with many other organisations over the years, including the local Lions Club, Plunket, the Historical Society and the Scouts. In fact many locals are closely involved with several of these groups at once.

Weather features prominently in our history, holding it in early December proved too risky and was one of the main reasons that the show date was changed in 1972 to be the last Saturday in February. Helensville A&P Show has continued to thrive while many other A&P shows have succumbed to changing times. Helensville A&P Show is now the largest one day show in the Northern Region and to this day is Helensville's largest event, a great day out for everybody.



General Conditions of the Helensville Agricultural & Pastoral Association

To be read in conjunction with Section Conditions and with the Rules and By-Laws of the Royal Agricultural Society of New Zealand.

Privacy Act

The Association holds records of names and addresses of all Members and Competitors and may publish these for the purposes of Show media reports or promotional purposes at the Association's discretion. The Association may take photographs and video images of Members, Competitors, exhibits (including livestock) and the employees, agents and assistants of any Competitor and use this information for reporting or promotional purposes in any media, at the Association's discretion.

Rights of the Helensville A&P Committee

The Helensville A&P Committee reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry without adducing any reason for so doing and reserves the right to make any alteration to the Show timetable, or withdraw any event as may be deemed desirable. Any unruly or dangerous animal or exhibit may be required to leave the Showground.

Protests

All protests must be in writing, and may be lodged with the Secretary one hour from the completion of the class judged, together with a deposit of \$50.00 which shall be returned should the protest be sustained. Should the protest be lodged before the Judges proceed to their duties, the onus of proof will rest with the Competitor; thereafter, the onus of proof will be with the party protesting. No protest will be received later than one hour after the prize tickets/ribbons are affixed.


The Helensville A&P Committee, or not less than five members thereof, will determine the results of all protests as soon as practicable. There shall be no appeal.

Health & Safety

- The Association will not be responsible for any accident, loss or damage that may be caused to or suffered by an exhibit, or which may be caused directly or indirectly by any other exhibit, notwithstanding any alleged negligence on the part of any officer or servant of the Association, and it shall be a condition of entry that each Competitor shall hold the Association indemnified against any claim in respect of any such accident, loss or damage caused by any exhibit of such Competitors. By signing the entry form declaration, Competitors accept the Association's conditions of entry and indemnify the Association under the provisions of the Health and Safety in Employment Act 1992.
- Each Competitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazards created or accidents, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals at the Showgrounds.

- Competitors must comply with the appropriate animal legislation and the Health and Safety in Employment Act 1992.
- The Association reserves the right to order immediate removal from the Showgrounds, of any animal it considers unruly or unmanageable.
- It is the Association's policy to see that all due care is taken to protect property and to protect and to keep in efficient order its own property, and to make provision for the protection of the property of others, but the Association shall not be liable to any person in case of loss or damage by reason of any defect, accident, negligence or neglect howsoever arising.
- Persons occupying grandstands, buildings, other structures or other seating accommodation on the Showgrounds do so at their own risk, and no claim shall be made against the Association in respect of any loss, or injury by reason of any defect of accident, or by reason of any act or omission whether negligent or otherwise, on the part of the Association or of any employee or agent of the Association or on the part of any other person.
- Parking is entirely at the owners' own risk. Any vehicles parked will be on this condition and the Association accepts no responsibility for any loss, theft, injury or damage attributed to any negligence on the part of the Association, its employees or stewards.

Completion of Entry Forms

- Entries must be made on the official entry forms, signed and accompanied by total entry fees payable and be in the hands of the Show Secretary on or before the closing dates advertised in the Schedule. Fax entries will not be accepted.
- Entry forms received that have not been signed, or where entry fees have been calculated incorrectly, will be returned immediately for correction. This requirement will apply to all Competitors, including Members of the Association that have not as yet paid their annual subscription but who have calculated entry fees using the discount available to financial Members.
- All entries must be made in the name of the bona-fide owner of the exhibits hereinafter called the Competitor, and such exhibits must have been the property of the Competitor at the time of entry. Registered lessees of animals are permitted to enter under their own name.

Membership

- Children of Members are eligible to claim entry fee discount.
- New Members - Discounted membership entry fees are available to current financial Members of the Helensville A&P Association. The Association's membership form may be completed and forwarded with entries. A membership application is at the back of this Schedule.

Membership Subscriptions

- Annual Individual Membership of the Helensville A&P Association is \$23.00. The membership year runs from 1 July – 30 June. See application form in the back of this Schedule.

Receipt of Entries

- Receipt of Entries - A receipt showing all details of your entries will be returned to you following data processing. Your entry form will NOT be returned to you.
- Responsibility - It will be your responsibility, the Competitor, to check the details on the Receipt of Entries carefully and ensure that all details are correct. Any alterations to Classes must be made to the Secretary by Friday, 17 February 2012 in writing (by post, fax or email). NO EXCEPTIONS - except Novice upgrading changes - see Conditions & Regulations of the Equestrian & Livestock Sections - Classification.

Substitutions

Substitutions must be advised in writing by 12 noon Wednesday 22 February 2012. Substitutions will only be accepted for the same number of entries already entered. No additional entries will be accepted.

Refund of Entry Fee

Competitors desiring refund of entry fees must apply in writing enclosing a Veterinarian's or Doctor's Certificate within SEVEN DAYS of the Show. Such applications will be considered by the Committee, and if successful, refund will be made less 25 %.

Competitors Entry Passes

Will be issued for postal entries only according to the following schedule -

Cattle - 1 - 7 cattle 2 passes, 8 cattle and over 3 passes.

Children Livestock - 1 pass per animal.

Goats - 1 - 4 goats 1 pass, 4 or more goats 2 passes.

Sheep - 1 - 4 sheep 1 pass, 4 or more sheep 2 passes.

Instructions to Judges and Stewards

Judges to report to the Secretary on arrival. If the judges consider that any exhibit does not come within the Regulations they are requested to report to the Senior Steward of the Class. In the event of there being no competition in any class, prizes may be given if the judges certify to particular merit, but they are specially requested to withhold prizes even where there is competition, if the exhibits are of inferior description, or not suitable for the class in which they are competing. The judges will be provided with a book containing the list of classes to be judged and prizes allotted thereto, and each judge is particularly requested to note in their book the number of the lot to which they award the prizes in the various classes, and sign the same.

Local

Local owner or local competitor is defined as resident within the area of the Kumeu subdivision of the Auckland Council.

Exhibiting

Competitors will be called only twice to the ring at which time they will be automatically scratched. All scratchings must be advised to the Steward as soon as possible.

Disease Control

TB Status. As per the current Biosecurity requirements.

All animals entered for showing or exhibiting must be from a current TB Clear Status Herd.

- **A copy of the current TB test certificate must be attached to entry forms.** The Association must be notified at the time of entry of any testing to be carried out after the closing date of entries or of any potential TB issues that may arise after entries have been submitted. Owners entering cattle must sign any declaration printed on the entry form.
- There are two documents required under the Animal Health Board regulations.
- First document is a TB Test Certificate. For animals from a Declared Movement Control Area – all animals aged three months or older are to be TB tested and have a clear test within 60 days prior to being moved to the Show. All other animals must be from a herd that is up to date with its current routine TB testing requirements.
- Second document is a TB Animals Status Declaration Card. All animals entered must be accompanied in transit by a signed and dated TB Animal Status Declaration Card showing a TB Clear status in accordance with present legislation. Animal individual numbers must be included on the TB test sheet. These cards may be inspected at the unloading area.
- It is a requirement that ALL cattle over the age of 30 days will be correctly identified using an official primary and secondary ear tag from the AHB or MINDA identification programme as implemented on 1 July 1999.
- All cattle must have in their ears the official primary and secondary ear tags.
- All animals being exhibited at the Show including any participating in a hoof and hooks carcass competition come under the standard ASD regulations.
- All sheep entered in the Show must be from a flock currently accredited Brucellosis free. Brucellosis Accreditation Certificates must accompany entry forms. Any entries received without accreditation will be returned to the Competitor. Entries will be accepted from ABF breeders with status being confirmed by Breed Societies.
- No exhibit entered in the sheep classes will be allowed on the ground if infested with external parasites or suffering from foot rot.
- The Association shall not be responsible for any loss or damage caused (inter alia) through disease or infection howsoever arising.
- Each Competitor shall be deemed to have guaranteed to the Association, by signature on their entry form, and have given warranty that each exhibit entered by him or brought upon the Showground, and every animal, bird, or other living thing brought by them onto the ground, is at the time of its entering upon the Showground free of any contagious or infectious disease.
- Any Competitor whose exhibit or animal that infringes this warranty shall be responsible to the Association, and to any other Competitor who may suffer by reason of such breach.

Should there be any reason to suspect that any exhibit is either diseased or dangerous; the Association shall have the right to refuse admission of such exhibit to the Showground or to remove the exhibit from the Showground at the expense of the Competitor.

It is a requirement that ALL cattle over the age of 30 days will be correctly identified using an official primary and secondary ear tag from the AHB or MINDA identification programme as implemented on 1 July 1999. AHB will be monitoring this.

All cattle must have in their ears the official primary and secondary AHB tags.

Inspection

The Committee reserves the right to inspect at random any cattle for tattoos or identification to establish TB Status, or to detect any malpractice of presentation in Dairy Cattle.

Championships

In all rings first prize winners only to parade for Champion. Once the Champion has been selected the second placed animal to the Champion MUST be allowed to parade for the judging of the Reserve Champion.

Prize Money

Prize money in all classes will be awarded in full. All prize money will be paid out on Show Day by the Stewards. All prizes are subject to confirmation from Sponsors.

Value of Points

The Points for prizes are as follows:

First Prize	counts 6 points
Second Prize	counts 4 points
Third Prize	counts 2 points
Highly Commended	counts 1 point
Champion	counts 2 points
Reserve Champion	counts 1 point

In the event of a tie, the largest number of first prizes will decide the matter, and if that fails to decide, then the value of the prize will be divided equally amongst those who have tied.

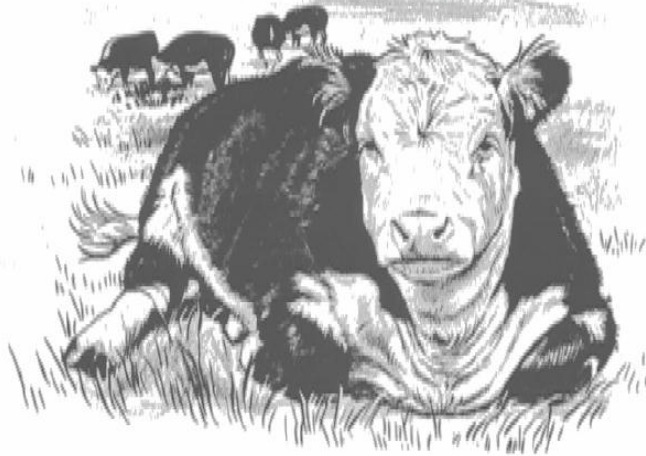

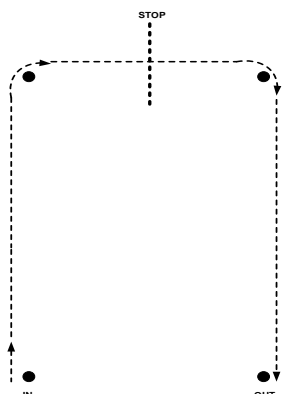
